
So did the guys at Continuum pop the champagne and sit back and chill out?

Enter the Criterion and Copperhead, naturally there will be many questions such as:

Is it comparable to the Caliburn system?
Is it the second best Analogue turntable in the world?
How much cheaper is it?

You may call us to find out for yourself. I will say this, you will never be unhappy with a Continuum Turntable, but as in life some people buy a Ferrari and are happy others lust after an Enzo...

These are finished as no other speaker I've ever seen. What they produce is every bit as lovely as their appearance. If you can afford them -- or even if you can't -- see if you can arrange an audition. I haven't heard every great speaker in the world but I'm convinced that the Piano deserves its place among the very best. There's something very different about these Pianos, something very special.

If I had to list my favorite aspects of the Tidal Piano's performance in order of preference, I'd have a difficult time deciding between its smooth well-balanced and fatigue-free character -- to which you really can listen to all day -- and its way with rhythm, timing and pace as it imbues music with a degree of life and conviction that few other speakers do. The Pianos make old recordings new and fun again and they really do have me discovering my music collection. The Piano's combination of midrange articulation and fine flowing dynamic expression is captivating. So smooth, so revealing; so sophisticated and expressive of nuance - so utterly satisfying.

Is there anyone not familiar with Lyra?

There are still deluded people out there who believe that despite all evidence to the contrary, vinyl still sounds superior to the latest and greatest digital formats. I tend to sit in this camp but I still play digital music!

The technology brigade believe that digital is almost perfect and tend to ignore their own ears and won't even entertain listening to a top vinyl system. Lyra feel that there are still major technical problems with phono cartridge design, which prevent the LP from realizing its full potential as a high-quality reproduction medium. We are therefore concentrating on designing MC phono cartridges that address those issues, and bring the sound of the LP one step closer to the master tape.

Each Lyra model is designed by Jonathan Carr in collaboration with Yoshinori Mishima, the artisan who also hand-crafts each piece. The ultimate goal of all Lyra cartridge designs is to accurately reproduce the exact contents of the record grooves without adding any signature of the

With almost every cartridge in the range winning several awards, what's the recommendation?

Well if you have a more modest turntable it's a no brainer the Dorian is streets ahead of the competition at AUS \$1,100 with Stereophile Class B recommendation and an excellent TAS review it will track well, not break up and retrieve huge amounts of detail with an excellent

If you have a higher quality turntable and arm then go for the new Skala, we have been raving about it as it's the first 5th generation cartridge from Lyra. You will instantly hear a tremendous sense of dynamics with incredible amounts of fine, low-level musical detail. The Skala combines this incredible detail retrieval with a tremendous sense of warmth and musicality. What's even more astounding is the noise level of this cartridge; it's almost undetectable! This is the most natural sounding, quietest phono cartridge ever to come form Lyra.
